

Minister Kaushik Rai, took part in a review meeting in Tezpur

Guwahati, January 19 : Minister for Food, Public Distribution and Consumer Affairs, Mines and Minerals, and Barak Valley Development etc. Kaushik Rai, convened a review meeting with officials from the Department of Food, Public Distribution & Consumer Affairs in Sonitpur district on Saturday. The meeting, held at the Conference Hall of the District Commissioner's Office, Sonitpur, was attended by the MLA of Tezpur LAC Prithiraj Rava, Commissioner of Food, Public Distribution, Consumer Affairs & Legal Metrology Shri Ananda Das, ACS; District Commissioner Ankur Bharali, and ADC (FPD&CA) cum Co-District Commissioner of Dhekiajuli Dyotiva Bora, among others.



During the meeting, Minister Rai reviewed the current status of NFSA/ration cards operational in the district. He highlighted the ongoing deliberations on rationalizing staff allocation across districts based on the number of functional ration cards, Fair Price Shops (FPS), and other relevant parameters to strengthen the public distribution system in Assam. Rai reiterated the government's commitment to ensuring that all eligible beneficiaries promptly receive their ration cards. Addressing the issue of AADHAAR seeding, the Minister directed officials to expedite the process, verify

the existing ration card beneficiaries facing difficulties, and ensure that no eligible beneficiary is deprived of their entitlements. He also focused on resolving the challenges faced by "zero transaction" FPS, emphasizing the need to eliminate bottlenecks affecting the public distribution system. Commissioner Ananda Das briefed the meeting on the department's functions in the district and highlighted the transition to an entirely online ration card distribution system. Speaking with Legal Metrology officials, Rai stressed the importance of strict monitoring of FPS operations and suggested forming joint task forces with other stakeholders to enhance vigilance. He underscored the importance of transparency and accountability in the system to benefit the underprivileged sections of society. The meeting also deliberated on the status of paddy procurement in the district, strategies to enhance public awareness campaigns, current market rates of essential commodities, and the e-KYC updation process. Rai commended the efforts of the district administration and urged all stakeholders to collaborate toward achieving a fair and equitable public distribution system. Deputy Director of Supply, Sonitpur Giridhar Deka, along with other departmental officials, District Agriculture Officer, FCI representatives, PPC managers, millers, grocery shopkeepers, and members of the North Assam Chambers of Commerce, actively contributed to the discussions.

NFR removes permanent speed restriction

Guwahati, January 19: The Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) is taking various measures to increase sectional speed of trains. In this regard, temporary and permanent speed restrictions are being removed wherever feasible. Moreover, speeds of train movement through loop lines have also been increased in various sections. This has resulted in the overall increase in speed of trains apart from improvement in punctuality and to offer enhanced



train services to passengers. NFR has removed/relaxed 10 Permanent Speed Restrictions (PSRs) up to the month of December, 2024. To remove the Permanent Speed Restrictions, the curve has been smoothened by adjusting the track geometry, reducing the

curvature and allowing for faster train speeds through those sections. Additionally, the bridges have been leveled to ensure that the tracks are flat and do not have any abrupt changes in gradient. The removal of this PSR is a testament to the hard work and dedication of the engineering team of NFR. Similarly, 44 nos. Temporary Speed Restrictions (TSRs) exist over NFR as of now. The speed enhancement work involves comprehensive upgrading of all infrastructures such as

track renewal, strengthening of bridges, easing of curves wherever feasible, improving signalling system etc. NFR has been actively working to improve track conditions and remove PSRs throughout its network. These efforts have included track renewal, track maintenance, and the installation of advanced signaling and control systems. The removal of this permanent speed restriction is just one example of the NFR commitment to providing safe and efficient rail travel for all.
